It's a stimulating, clever comic book whose stories examine topical subjects pertinent to modern agriculture.

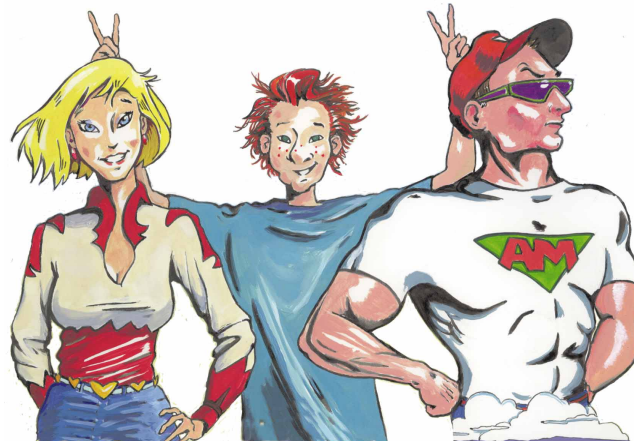
Ag Man is the creation of Baxter and his brother Bob. It is written to support students and teachers who sense the need for a balance of information in an increasingly urban world.
